HUD's Manufactured Home Dispute Resolution Program is intended to address defects in construction, safety and installation. The program is not intended to address cosmetic issues and contractual agreements. If you believe there is a construction, safety or installation issue with your home, be sure to notify the retailer, manufacturer or installer first

All states have a Manufactured Home Dispute Resolution Program.

Ask Dave

Q: What happens after I submit a request for HUD dispute resolution?

A: The complaint will be reviewed by the Federal dispute resolution neutral screener. If alleged items are found to be a non-conformance to the

Manufactured Construction and Safety Standards (CFR 3280) or the Model Installation Standards (CFR 3285), a mediation will be held and all parties noticed of the date and time of the mediation.
