# HUD's Manufactured Housing Consensus Committee concludes meetings on U.S. DOE's new energy standards

On May 31, 2022, the **U.S. Department of Energy** (DOE) published its <u>final rule for manufactured housing energy standards</u>, which will be implemented May 31, 2023. The rule does not, however, fully align with the current **Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards** ("HUD Code"). In October and November, the **Manufactured Housing Consensus Committee** (MHCC) met to discuss, analyze, and recommend possible changes to the HUD Code.

MHCC recommended including much of the DOE language into the HUD Code either directly or by reference and recommended adopting the increased energy conservation standards for single-section homes. However, a majority of the committee recommended the HUD Code include a smaller increase in the conservation standard for multi-section homes.

The many levels of review required for a proposed change in federal regulations likely means MHCC proposed changes cannot take effect until after the new DOE standards have already been implemented. It also is not clear that HUD's committee still has any authority over energy standards or if action taken by Congress has given DOE the final word. # HUD's Manufactured Housing Consensus Committee has open positions

The **Manufactured Housing Consensus Committee** (MHCC) is a committee of **U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development** (HUD). It plays a role in the development of manufactured housing regulations. It has 21 members with seven members each representing consumers, producers, and government agencies. Travel and per diem is provided for members to attend meetings. <u>HUD is now seeking nominations for MHCC terms that are expiring December 31, 2022</u>.

# Negotiations continue, Congress works to pass 2023 federal budget

Leaders in the **U.S. House of Representatives** and **U.S. Senate** are still working to reach an agreement on a **final spending bill for fiscal year (FY) 2023** before December 16, when the current continuing resolution (CR) expires. Lawmakers have until December 16 to extend the CR or pass a final spending bill, or they risk a shutdown of the federal government. The FY23 spending bill is one of the last opportunities this year for Congress to make robust investments in affordable housing and homelessness programs, including a **Manufactured Housing Improvement Grant** program to address critical health and safety issues.

Both the House and Senate FY23 budget drafts provided increases to HUD's affordable housing, homelessness, and community development programs. However, the House proposal included \$3 billion more in needed investments than the Senate proposal, including full funding to renew all Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) vouchers and to expand the program to an additional 140,000 households with low-incomes. In comparison, the Senate proposal provided funding to renew existing vouchers but would only expand the program by 5,000 new vouchers.

The **National Low-Income Housing Coalition** has prepared an analysis of the **House draft**, the **Senate draft**, and an **updated budget chart**.
