Preservation and Reinvestment Initiative For Community Enhancement

In 2022, Congress created a new program, the Preservation and Reinvestment Initiative for Community Enhancement (PRICE) program. PRICE will provide \$225 million to preserve and revitalize some manufactured homes and communities (MHCs), home to 8.5 million Americans. This bill would make this one-year competitive grant program permanent.

The funds would be available for a variety of uses (including relocation assistance and eviction prevention), the primary purpose is to bring community infrastructure up to code, providing clean drinking water and safe sanitation, and to increase resiliency in the face of increasing flood, fire, and storm events. PRICE will also support acquisitions, including resident purchases. It can also be sued to replace pre-76 homes for resiliency and energy-savings for the lowest-income homeowners.

PRICE is available for local governments, resident-owned cooperatives, housing authorities, nonprofits, tribes and community development financial institutions or other entities. Infrastructure improvements could upgrade water, sewer, septic and electric systems. Investments can repair roads, storm water drainage and sidewalks too. Funds can also support home improvements such as removing abandoned and blighted homes, improving foundations and upgrading or adding storm shelters. Funds can also be used for eviction prevention and relocation assistance.

Priority will be given to communities that are home to low- and moderate income homeowners and that "preserve long-term housing affordability."

Manufactured Home Residents

- Seven percent of U.S. households live in manufactured homes with about half living in communities or parks.
- Manufactured home communities serve a population with median household income of around \$35,000 and the average price of a manufactured home was \$108,500 in 2020, less than half the national average for site-built homes.
